***SPECIAL COUNCIL MEETING
JANUARY 5, 2016
4:00 P.M.***

A special meeting of the Kirkwood City Council was held on January 5, 2016 at 4:00 p.m. to discuss grant funds received from East-West Gateway to be used towards a Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) project. Two applications were submitted to East-West Gateway and one must be accepted. Present were Mayor McDonnell, Council Members Biedenstein, Griffin, Jaksetic, Luetzow, Sears and Ward. Also in attendance were Chief Administrative Officer Russell Hawes, City Clerk Betty Montañó, and City Engineer Ted Dunkman.

City Engineer Ted Dunkman gave a brief explanation of the two applications: Argonne Drive Pedestrian Improvements Project and South Kirkwood Road – Nipher Middle School Safe Route to School. A discussion took place. Question was raised regarding if the City could fund the South Kirkwood Road project and the council accept the Argonne Drive project, so that both projects could move forward. TAP Applications that are not accepted can be resubmitted to East-West Gateway in the following year for consideration.

Motion was made by Council Member Jaksetic and seconded by Council Member Sears to accept the TAP Application titled South Kirkwood Road – Nipher Middle School Safe Route to School. A discussion took place. The motion was approved with Council Members Biedenstein, Griffin, Jaksetic, Sears and Ward in favor. Council Member Luetzow and Mayor McDonnell were opposed.

With no further issues to come before the council, the meeting was adjourned.
