# **Remember: Break Down Cardboard Boxes & Yard Waste Stickers**

All cardboard boxes must be broken down when being placed in your bins and at the recycling center.

All recycling and trash bin lids must be closed and anything left outside the bin will not be picked up.

If you ever have questions about what can or can't be recycled you can easily find that information in the Kirkwood Recycles app. Just use the Wizard icon at the bottom and search for an item.

Here are a few guick reminders:

- Pizza boxes cannot be recycled. They should be placed in your black trash bin.
- Please leave three feet between your trash bin, recycling bin, and yard waste bags.

# Resident Admission Policies

- Residents of Kirkwood, Glendale and Oakland receive resident rates on all aquatic programs and passes. Residents can enter the facility by paying daily admission or purchasing a season pass
- For entry, you will need to present a Kirkwood Parks and Recreation-issued ID card. No other form of ID will be accepted.
- Each ID card holder will be allowed up to 4 guests per day. All guests of residents will pay nonresident auest daily admission

# To Obtain an ID Card

- Visit the Kirkwood Community Center during normal business hours.
- Present a current MO Drivers License or State ID showing the residential address as well as a current utility bill (gas, water, electric, or phone), bank statement, or voter ID card, issued to the home
- address within the last three months. ID cards cost \$15 (originals and replacements) and are valid for 3 years after issue date.
