

KHRC Announced Winners of its Annual **Essay Contest**



The Kirkwood Human Rights Commission announced the winners of its Annual Essay Contest which was open to juniors residing within the Kirkwood School District boundaries. Eligible participants included students attending Kirkwood High School, Ursuline Academy, Vianney High School, and homeschooled students.

Update on Street and Sidewalk **Projects in Kirkwood**

Grant's Trail Extension, Phase 1 Project - The project is currently under design. The proposed Grant's Trail Extension, Phase 1 project is a two-way side path trail from East Argonne Dr/South Taylor Avenue intersection to the East Monroe Avenue/South Fillmore Avenue intersection to Leffingwell Avenue/south of Union Pacific Railroad to Grant's trailhead at South Holmes Avenue, south of the BNSF Railroad. An estimated right-of-way acquisition is for the Fall of 2026 with construction start estimated for Winter 2027.

Clay Avenue Resurfacing Project – The project is under design with a Public meeting scheduled from 4:00 - 7:00 p.m., July 11, 2024 at KPAC. The proposed pavement preservation project is on Clay Ave. from Adams Avenue at the northern limits to Woodbine Avenue at the south project limit, roughly 0.630 miles. This project excludes improvements to the concrete pavement between Argonne Drive and Madison Avenue. The bridge over the UP railroad is located within this exclusion.

The Clay Ave. project will consist of the following improvements:

- Asphalt Milling and Overlay (Approximately 3,325 Linear Feet)
- Concrete Curb Repair Approximately 80% of curbs are anticipated to be replaced
- Non-ADA Compliant Concrete Curb Ramp Replacements
- Non-ADA Compliant Sidewalk Replacement
- Raised intersections at Jefferson and Argonne
- ADA Compliant Crosswalks / Realign Skewed Crosswalks
- Minimal Enclosed Storm Sewer System Modifications
- Pavement Marking & Signage Updates

Right-of-Way acquisition is scheduled for Winter 2024-25 with an estimated construction start of Winter 2025-26.

Lindeman Road Resurfacing Project - Lindeman Road resurfacing, sidewalk upgrade, bikes and pedestrian signalized crossings project has completed Right-of-Way acquisition and is estimated to begin construction this year.

West Essex Infrastructure Upgrades - Between Kirkwood and Geyer Roads, a new water main was installed in the Summer of 2023. New overhead electric lines were installed in the Fall of 2023. Starting in Spring/Summer of 2024, a street and sidewalk reconstruction project will begin. Property owners are being contacted currently for easement acquisition for the project.

South Geyer Road Surfacing Project - This project from Adams to Big Bend is nearing completion. This project will include new ADA-compliant curb ramps, milling of the road surface for a new overlay, improved pavement markings, pedestrian improvements at crosswalks and the railroad crossing, and new traffic signals at Argonne Avenue. Milling and paving is anticipated to begin late June and will be completed, weather permitting by early August of 2024.

MODOT Federal Projects

Manchester Road - Phase 1 (East of Kirkwood Road) is completed in Kirkwood. Buffered and wider sidewalks, decorative pedestrian lighting, and City entrance monuments have been installed. These improvements could be considered once-in-a-lifetime upgrades to the Manchester Road Corridor in Kirkwood.

Manchester Road - Phase 2 (West of Kirkwood Road) is under construction and is scheduled for completion in 2024.

Lindbergh Boulevard Resurfacing Project - (North of Swan Avenue). Work is going on at the intersection of Manchester Road and Lindbergh

Lindbergh Boulevard Resurfacing Project - (South of BNSF RR). Sidewalk and median replacement is going on south of the BNSF RR tracks.

Historic Kirkwood Train Station Renovation - The City is underway in getting final approvals from Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT), as this significant renovation project has a majority of its funding from federal and state grants. The scope of the project includes both exterior and interior renovations. The exterior renovations include a reproduction of the extended canopy towards Kirkwood Road, similar to how it was in 1893, and a new slate and copper roof. The interior of the station will reflect the style of 1941 keeping many features enjoyed today, and updates will include a volunteer desk, bathrooms, and new flooring. Additional upgrades are a redesigned site plaza, construction of a new storage building, and reconstruction of the parking lot. The renovation work is expected to start in late Summer or Fall 2024, after the project bidding process is completed.
