### Kirkwood, Missouri Parks and Recreation Needs Assessment Survey Executive Summary

#### **Overview**

ETC Institute administered a needs assessment survey for the City of Kirkwood, Missouri during the early months of 2024. The purpose of the survey was to help determine parks and recreation priorities for the community.

#### Methodology

ETC Institute mailed a survey packet to a random sample of households throughout the City of Kirkwood. Each survey packet contained a cover letter, a copy of the survey, and a postage-paid return envelope. Residents who received the survey were given the option of returning the survey by mail or completing it online.

After the surveys were mailed, ETC Institute followed up with residents to encourage participation. To prevent people who were not residents of Kirkwood from participating, everyone who completed the survey online was required to enter their home address prior to submitting their survey. ETC Institute then matched the addresses entered online with the addresses originally selected for the random sample. If the address from a survey completed online did not match one of the addresses selected for the sample, the online survey was not included in the final database for this report.

The survey aimed to collect a minimum of 400 completed responses from residents, and this target was surpassed with 499 completed surveys collected. The overall results for the sample of 499 residents have a precision of at least +/-4.4% at the 95% level of confidence.

The major findings of the survey are summarized in the following pages.

#### Parks/Facilities/Programs Use

**Parks/Facilities Use:** Based on the sum of top four choices, respondents selected the facilities that they visit most often. The most visited facilities were: Kirkwood Park (90%), aquatic center (46%), and Kirkwood Community Center (39%). They were also asked what barriers prevented them from visiting facilities more often. The common barriers were: lack of amenities we want to use (42%), not aware of parks' or facilities' location (32%), and use parks/facilities in other cities/county (21%).

**Programs/Events Use:** Fifty-nine percent (59%) responded that they have participated in a program/event in the past year. They gave ratings to these programs. 27% rated "excellent," 58% rated "good," 13% rated "fair," and 1% rated "poor." For those that said they have not participated in any programs/events in the past year, they selected reasons why. The common reasons were: old & outdated facilities (31%), I don't know what is offered (29%), and too busy/not interested (21%).

#### **Outside Organization**

Respondents selected the organizations that they used for recreation/sports activities in the past year. The common organizations were: City of Kirkwood (70%), private clubs (38%), and neighboring cities (34%).

#### Communication

Respondents selected all the ways they learn about the City's parks, recreation facilities, programs, and events. The common used resources were: recreation activity brochure (60%), word of mouth (57%), and city website (52%). Based on the sum of top three choices, the most common used resources were: recreation activity brochure (49%), emails (40%), and social media (40%).

### Benefits, Importance, and Improvements to Parks and Recreation

**Agreement:** Respondents rated their level of agreement with the following statements concerning some potential benefits of the City's parks and recreation services. The most agreed statements were: contributes to a higher quality of life in Kirkwood (90%), preserves open space & protects the environment (87%), and makes Kirkwood a more desirable place to live (87%).

**Importance:** Respondents rated how important it is for the City to provide high quality parks, recreation facilities, and programs. 91% felt it was very important, 8% felt it was somewhat important, and 1% felt it was not important.

**Support:** Respondents rated their level of support for the following actions (listed in the survey) the City could take to improve the parks and recreation system. The most supported actions were: improve outdoor aquatic center (79%), update playgrounds (78%), and improve underutilized parks (65%). Based on the sum of top two choices, the most supported actions were: improve outdoor aquatic center (58%), update playgrounds (43%), and improve underutilized parks (32%).

#### **Recreation Facilities/Amenities Needs and Priorities**

**Facility Needs**: Respondents were asked to identify if their household had a need for 22 recreation facilities and amenities and to rate how well their needs for each were currently being met. Based on this analysis, ETC Institute was able to estimate the number of households in the community that had the greatest "unmet" need for various facilities.

The three facilities with the highest percentage of households that have an unmet need:

- 1. Walking paths in parks
- 2. Large community parks
- 3. Shade & trees

**Facility Importance:** In addition to assessing the needs for each facility, ETC Institute also assessed the importance that residents placed on each item. Based on the sum of respondents' top four choices, these were the four facilities that ranked most important to residents:


- 1. Community center
- 2. Multi-use hiking, biking, walking trails
- 3. Swimming pools
- 4. Large community parks

**Priorities for Facility Investments:** The **Priority Investment Rating (PIR)** was developed by ETC Institute to provide organizations with an objective tool for evaluating the priority that should be placed on recreation and parks investments. The Priority Investment Rating (PIR) equally weighs (1) the importance that residents place on facilities and (2) how many residents have unmet needs for the facilities. [Details regarding the methodology for this analysis are provided in Section 4 of this report.]

Based the Priority Investment Rating (PIR), the following facilities were rated as high priorities for investment:

- Community center (PIR=200)
- Swimming pools (PIR=155)
- Multi-use hiking, biking, walking trails (PIR=155)
- Walking paths in parks (PIR=119)
- Large community parks (PIR=102)

The chart in the next page shows the Priority Investment Rating for each of the 22 facilities assessed in the survey.



#### **Recreation Programs/Activities Needs and Priorities**

**Programs Needs**: Respondents were asked to identify if their household had a need for 27 recreation programs and to rate how well their needs for each were currently being met. Based on this analysis, ETC Institute was able to estimate the number of households in the community that had the greatest "unmet" need for various programs.

The three programs with the highest percentage of households that have an unmet need:

- 1. Adult fitness & wellness programs
- 2. Exercise classes
- 3. Performing arts events

**Program Importance:** In addition to assessing the needs for each program, ETC Institute also assessed the importance that residents placed on each item. Based on the sum of respondents' top four choices, these were the four facilities that ranked most important to residents:


- 1. Adult fitness & wellness programs
- 2. Performing arts events
- 3. Exercise classes
- 4. Pickleball/tennis lessons & leagues

**Priorities for Program Investments:** The **Priority Investment Rating (PIR)** was developed by ETC Institute to provide organizations with an objective tool for evaluating the priority that should be placed on program investments. The Priority Investment Rating (PIR) equally weighs (1) the importance that residents place on facilities and (2) how many residents have unmet needs for the programs. [Details regarding the methodology for this analysis are provided in Section 4 of this report.]

Based the Priority Investment Rating (PIR), the following programs were rated as high priorities for investment:

- Adult fitness & wellness programs (PIR=200)
- Exercise classes (PIR=141)

The chart below shows the Priority Investment Rating for each of the 27 programs assessed in the survey.



#### **Investment Priorities**

**Recommended Priorities.** In order to help the City identify investment priorities, ETC Institute conducted an Importance-Satisfaction (I-S) analysis. This analysis examined the importance residents placed on each facility and the level of satisfaction with each facility. By identifying services of high importance and low satisfaction, the analysis identified which facilities will have the most impact on overall satisfaction with the parks and recreation facilities in the future. If the City wants to improve its overall satisfaction rating, the City should prioritize investments in facilities with the highest Importance Satisfaction (I-S) ratings. Details regarding the methodology for the analysis are provided in Section 5 of this report.


**Overall Priorities for the Facilities by Major Category.** This analysis reviewed the importance of and satisfaction with the facilities. This analysis was conducted to help set the overall priorities for the facilities. Based on the results of this analysis, the facilities that are recommended as the top priorities in order to raise the facilities' overall satisfaction rating are listed below:

- Kirkwood Community Center (I-S = 0.36)
- Aquatic Center (I-S = 0.16)
- Ice Arena (I-S = 0.08)





by percentage of respondents who selected the items as one of their top four choices


## Q4. Which four parks/facilities do you feel is in greatest need of improvement or maintenance?



by percentage of respondents who selected the items as one of their top four choices


## Q5. Please check all of the following reasons that prevent you/your household from visiting facilities more often.




## Q6. From the following list, please check all the ways you learn about the City of Kirkwood parks, recreation facilities, programs, and events.




# Q7. Which three methods of communication would you most prefer the City use to communicate with you about parks, recreation facilities, programs, and events?





## Q8. From the following list, please check all of the organizations that you/your household have used for recreation and sports activities during the last year.




#### Q9. Has your household participated in any programs or events during the past year?




## Q9a. How would you rate the overall quality of the programs or events in which your household has participated?






#### Q12. Which four facilities/amenities are most important to your household?








## Q16. If you had \$100, how would you allocate the funds among the parks and recreation categories listed below?








### Q18. Please rate your level of support for each of the following actions the City of Kirkwood could take to improve the parks and recreation system.


#### Q19. Which two actions are the most important to your household?






### Q21. How many years have you lived in Kirkwood?




### Q22. Which of the following best describes your race/ethnicity?




# Please check all of the reasons that prevent you from visiting parks and recreation facilities and amenities or what prevents you from visiting them more often.

by % of respondents (multiple selections could be made)




### Have you/your household participated in any recreation programs offered in your community during the past year?


# Please rate the overall condition of all the recreation programs you/your households have visited over the past year.




# If your household has not participated in any recreation programs in your community during the past year, please check all of the reasons that prevent you from participating.

### **Priority Investment Rating (PIR)**

#### **Overview**

The Priority Investment Rating (PIR) was developed by ETC Institute to provide governments with an objective tool for evaluating the priority that should be placed on parks and recreation investments. The Priority Investment Rating was developed by ETC Institute to identify the facilities/programs residents think should receive the highest priority for investment. The Priority Investment Rating reflects the importance residents place on items (sum of top 4 choices) and the unmet needs (needs that are only being met 50% or less) for each facility/program relative to the facility/program that rated the highest overall. Since decisions related to future investments should consider both the level of unmet need and the importance of facilities/programs, the PIR weights each of these components equally.

The PIR reflects the sum of the Unmet Needs Rating and the Importance Rating as shown in the equation below:

$$PIR = UNR + IR$$

For example, suppose the Unmet Needs Rating for playgrounds is 26.5 (out of 100) and the Importance Rating for playgrounds is 52 (out of 100), the Priority Investment Rating for playgrounds would be 78.5 (out of 200).

How to Analyze the Charts:


- High Priority Areas are those with a PIR of at least 100. A rating of 100 or above generally indicates there is a relatively high level of unmet need and residents generally think it is important to fund improvements in these areas. Improvements in this area are likely to have a positive impact on the greatest number of households.
- Medium Priority Areas are those with a PIR of 50-99. A rating in this range generally indicates there is a medium to high level of unmet need or a significant percentage of residents generally think it is important to fund improvements in these areas.
- Low Priority Areas are those with a PIR below 50. A rating in this range generally indicates there is a relatively low level of unmet need and residents do not think it is important to fund improvements in these areas. Improvements may be warranted if the needs of very specialized populations are being targeted.







#### Overview

Today, officials have limited resources which need to be targeted to facilities that are of the most benefit to their residents. Two of the most important criteria for decision making are (1) to target resources toward services of the highest importance to citizens; and (2) to target resources toward those facilities where citizens are the least satisfied.

The Importance-Satisfaction (IS) rating is a unique tool that allows public officials to better understand both of these highly important decision-making criteria for each of the facilities they are providing. The Importance-Satisfaction rating is based on the concept that public agencies will maximize overall customer satisfaction by emphasizing improvements in those areas where the level of satisfaction is relatively low, and the perceived importance of the service is relatively high.

#### Methodology

The rating is calculated by summing the percentage of responses for items selected as the first, second, and third most important services for the City to emphasize. The sum is then multiplied by 1 minus the percentage of respondents who indicated they were positively satisfied with the City's performance in the related area (the sum of the ratings of 4 and 5 on a 5-point scale excluding "Don't Know" responses). "Don't Know" responses are excluded from the calculation to ensure the satisfaction ratings among service categories are comparable. [IS=Importance x (1-Satisfaction)].

Example of the Calculation: Respondents were asked to identify the recreation facilities they think should receive the most emphasis from the City. Fifty-four percent (53.7%) of respondents selected *Kirkwood Community Center*, as one of the most important facilities for the City to emphasize.

With regard to satisfaction, 32.7% of respondents surveyed rated the City's overall performance in the *Kirkwood Community Center*, as a "4" or "5" on a 5-point scale (where "5" means "Very Satisfied") excluding "Don't Know" responses. The I-S rating for *Kirkwood Community Center*, was calculated by multiplying the sum of the most important percentages by 1 minus the sum of the satisfaction percentages. In this example 53.7% was multiplied by 32.7% (1-0.327). This calculation yielded an I-S rating of 0.13 which ranked third out of 19 parks and recreation facilities categories.

The maximum rating is 1.00 and would be achieved when 100% of the respondents select an item as one of their top three choices to emphasize over the next two years and 0% indicate they are positively satisfied with the delivery of the facility.

The lowest rating is 0.00 and could be achieved under either of the following two situations:

- If 100% of the respondents were positively satisfied with the delivery of the service
- If none (0%) of the respondents selected the service as one for the three most important areas for the County to emphasize over the next two years.

#### **Interpreting the Ratings**

Ratings that are greater than or equal to 0.20 identify areas that should receive significantly more emphasis over the next two years. Ratings from 0.10 to 0.20 identify service areas that should receive increased emphasis. Ratings less than 0.10 should continue to receive the current level of emphasis.

- Definitely Increase Emphasis (IS>=0.20)
- Increase Current Emphasis (0.10<=IS<0.20)
- Maintain Current Emphasis (IS<0.10)
