## YOUR KIRKWOOD PARK BOARD

The Kirkwood Park Board consists of nine members, appointed by the Kirkwood City Council for rotating three-year terms. The primary focus of the Park Board is the maintenance and planning for parks within the park system, and directly responsible for expenditures from the Park Maintenance Fund.

Much of the Park Board's work is guided by the 2005 Parks and Recreation Master Plan, and a strategic plan that was formulated in 2016. A community survey, completed in 2011, also guides the board. Many objectives in the master plan have been met, with more to come. Work was recently completed on development of the Prairie/Wetlands area in Greentree Park, paid for by funds from Kirkwood's Parks, Recreation and Stormwater Sales Tax Fund. Parks and Recreation Services are funded primarily through three sources. These three sources are:

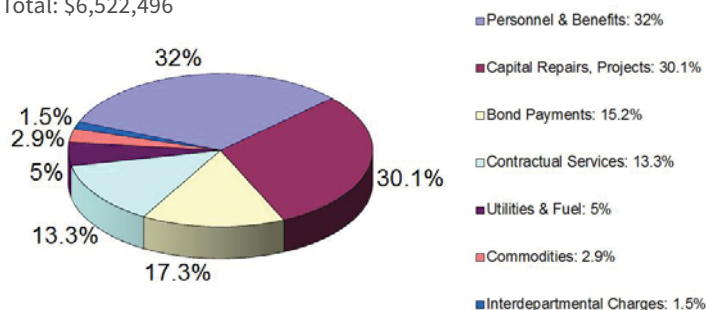
1. ½ Cent Parks, Recreation and Stormwater Sales Tax
2. 13 Cent Property Tax for Park Maintenance
3. Fees and Charges for Services

Other funding sources include grants, donations, interest on fund balances and sale of surplus equipment.

The charts below show revenues and expenditures for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2018, and are based on preliminary, unaudited figures. Please note the information below reflects all funding for parks and recreation services, including funds controlled directly by the Park Board as well as funds controlled by City Council.

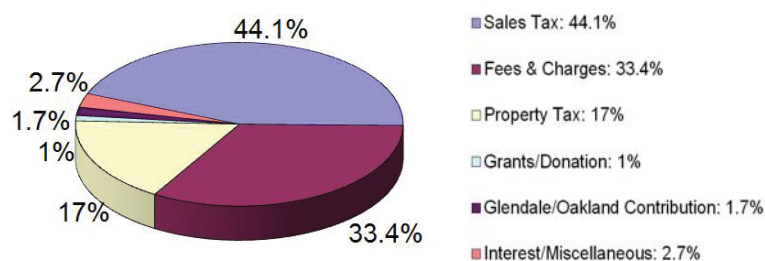
## FY 2017-18 EXPENSES
