To promote the values of diversity and the elimination of discrimination, provide educational opportunities for the Kirkwood Community, and facilitate enhanced community connections.

- A. Monitor and review communication resources
- B. Build collaborative relationships with community based organizations, faith communities, media and other groups to more effectively promote human rights in Kirkwood, in the spirit of the Mediation Agreement.
- C. Host events in the Kirkwood community and/or collaborate with other groups in the community to share concerns, discuss issues, celebrate diversity, and be informed of successes.
- D. Ensure Commissioners participate in HRC related training experiences.
- E. Prepare a quarterly cumulative report of activities of HRC, approve and submit an Annual Report to the City Council, and present in an open City Council meeting.
- F. Network and advocate for effective policy changes regarding human rights. Contact the Missouri Commission on Human Rights, Empower Missouri Human Rights Task Force, Human Rights Roundtable, and others for input.
- G. Collaborate with the City of Kirkwood (the Public Information Office) in updating the ADA & Support Services website tab.
- H. This Strategic Plan is to be reviewed and updated annually in January of each year by the HRC, and during the year as needed showing the updated plan.
- I. Continue development on the HRC police report addressing Police Department demographic, training, complaints, and traffic stops.
