Resident Admission Policies

- Residents of Kirkwood, Glendale and Oakland receive resident rates on all aquatic programs and passes. Residents can enter the facility by paying daily admission or purchasing a season pass.
- For entry, you will need to present a Kirkwood Parks and Recreation-issued ID card. No other form of ID will be accepted.
- Each ID card holder will be allowed up to 4 guests per day. All guests of residents will pay nonresident guest daily admission fees.

To Obtain an ID Card

- Visit the Kirkwood Community Center during normal business hours
- Present a current MO Drivers License or State ID showing the residential address as well as a current utility bill (gas, water, electric, or phone), bank statement, or voter ID card, issued to the home address within the last three months
- ID cards cost \$5 (originals and replacements) and are valid for 3 years after issue date
- Everyone 4 and older must have an ID card

In 2018, the Kirkwood Human Rights Commission continued its commitment to working with other agencies to ensure the promise of equal rights for all is fully realized in our City.

Some of the Primary Duties of Your Kirkwood Human Rights Commission:

- ◆ Formulate and conduct educational programs and initiatives to minimize or eliminate discriminatory acts and bias.
- ◆ Provide a forum for individuals who believe they have been victims of discrimination or bias.
- ◆ Cooperate with other organizations as well as private and public educational institutions to seek ways to eliminate discrimination and bias and to celebrate diversity.



Some Accomplishments Over the Past Year:

- ◆ We have continued our association and cooperation with the Alliance for Interracial Dignity, the Meacham Park Neighborhood Improvement Association, the Kirkwood-Des Peres Chamber, and the Missouri Human Rights Commission, and have established connections with Metropolitan Congregations United and the Kirkwood Social Justice Coalition.
- ◆ Our relationship with the Kirkwood Police Department deepened in 2018. Regular meetings with Chief Brian Murphy covered topics including body cameras, tasers, and traffic stops, with a focus on avoidance of bias in all police interactions with the public. Chief Murphy also spoke to the Commission about the presentation on eliminating racial bias in policing, hosted by the Ellisville and Chesterfield police departments. He also reviewed bias training Kirkwood officers receive.
- ◆ We have greatly increased the level of our cooperation with the Kirkwood R-7 School District and the administration at Kirkwood High School, working to assist them in addressing achievement and discipline gaps.
- ◆ Again in 2018, we conducted a successful essay contest to give high school juniors a voice in our work for social justice. Essay winner Maisie Bradley read her essay to the audience at the 2019 Martin Luther King Day celebration, to much applause.
