Summer Saturday concerts start at 7:30 p.m. In Lions Amphitheatre in Kirkwood Park. Kirkwood Park is located at the corner of Geyer Road and Adams Avenue. Concerts are FREE and open to the public. Donations are welcome. Produced and hosted by the Kirkwood Arts Commission, with generous support from Kirkwood Parks & Recreation, the Kirkwood ARTS Foundation, the *Webster-Kirkwood Times*, and the Clifford Willard Gaylord Foundation.

**Art at the Station** is a community visual arts program hosted and produced by the Commission at the historic Kirkwood Train Station, 110 W. Argonne Drive in downtown Kirkwood. Exhibits are free and open to the public. Donations are welcome. Art can be viewed when the Station is open for passengers.

This month's Artist/illustrator is Kirkwood native **Bryan Haynes**. He exhibits paintings illustrating stories of towns west of Kirkwood strung along the Missouri River. Bryan Haynes' work has been described as New Regionalism. Since graduating from the Art Center College of Design in California in 1983 his artwork has been represented by Bernstein & Andriulli in New York, Ron Sweet in San Francisco, and Foster Represents in St. Louis. His work will be on display through March 29th.

**2020 Photo Competition:** The fourth annual photo competition will be co-sponsored by the Kirkwood Arts Commission and the Department of Parks and Recreation. The theme this year is "Faces and Places of Kirkwood". Look for details to be announced in April.

Originally built in 1893, the station was last renovated in 1941.

**RESTORATION PROJECT INCLUDES:**

- Design & preliminary engineering
- New roof
- New geothermal heating/cooling system
- Tuckpointing
- Window & door restoration
- Restrooms, expanded & ADA-compliant
- Interior restoration (flooring, walls, ceiling, lighting, etc.)
- Site improvements & utilities
- New ancillary storage building
- New covered platform
- Outdoor plaza & landscaping

**TOTAL ESTIMATED COST: \$3,800,000**
