## Requirements

- ✓ Be 14-21 years of age

- ✓ Able to attend 4 meetings a month and most details with prior notice
- ✓ Must be in good health and physical condition
- ✓ Must pass a background investigation

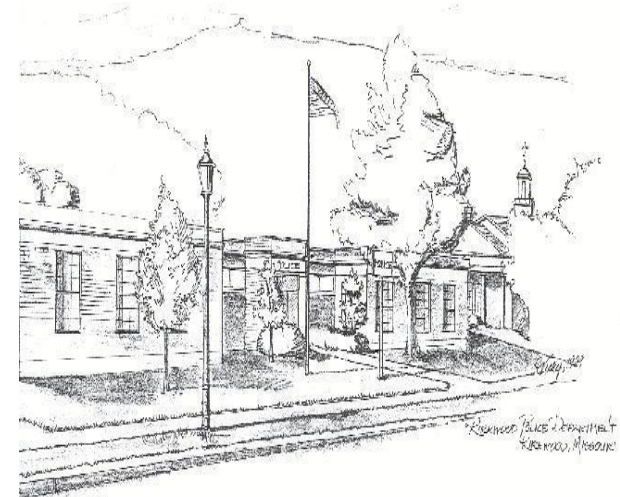

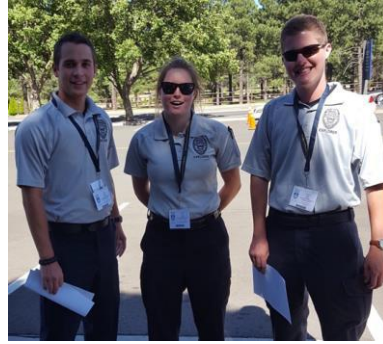
