continue to be impacted by the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) and as always, the health, safety, and well-being of our employees and residents

We are continuously updating our best practices and following guidance from the St. Louis County Health Department and the CDC, including cancellations of events, postponing non-essential projects, instituting remote work policies and utilizing staggered work shifts. We are also employing heightened cleaning, safety, and disinfecting practices at City facilities.

Our community and region we expect to experience for the foreseeable future. Rest assured that essential emergency public safety services such as police and fire will continue as normal. Plans have been developed and implemented to guarantee that these services are delivered without interruption.

> At present, public services and municipal utilities have modified their daily operations to protect staff from the virus. Departments have divided staff into split shifts and restricted the number of workers on duty to minimize the impact of any loss of staff if cross contamination, tracing and/ or quarantine issues occur. The reduction of staff on duty has resulted in an inability to process the normal volume of work requests. For the Electric department specifically, this means work orders have been prioritized to address power delivery and restoration issues at the

expense of street lighting and tree trimming service requests. We will continue to monitor the situation and modify our operations as necessary to perform at the highest level possible.

The duration and scope of these effects remain unclear and will require adjustment as we all work together to navigate and mitigate the effects of this pandemic. Our goal is to remain open throughout this pandemic in order to safely provide you with the quality public services you have come to expect from Kirkwood.

We appreciate your patience, and continued support. Stay safe and healthy and know that we, as always, remain committed to serving you.
