City of Kirkwood Awarded \$1.5 Million **Grant for Train Station Restoration**

The City of Kirkwood received notice that it was awarded a Transportation Alternatives program grant through the East-West Gateway Council of Governments for the Historic Kirkwood Train Station Restoration project that the City is undertaking in conjunction with the Historic Kirkwood Train Station Foundation. The \$1.5 million award will support various interior and exterior renovations to the train station such as; a new roof, heating and cooling system, window and door restoration, ADA compliant restrooms and ticket counter, an accessory storage building, as well as a covered exterior platform for train passengers.

The Train Station Foundation has been hard at work raising the \$4.6 million needed to complete the project. This grant, along with

generous donations from individual donors and grants already received by the Foundation, brings the amount raised to date for the project to \$2,268,367.00, or nearly half-way to the estimated \$4.6 million cost of this exciting project that will be the station's first

The Foundation is continuing its fundraising efforts, via a GoFundMe page and other programs, to reach their \$4.9 million goal, as construction is not expected to start until 2024. Kirkwood and Des Peres Begin Police, Fire and EMS **Dispatching Partnership**

The cities of Kirkwood and Des Peres have executed a 5-year dispatching partnership in which all emergency 911 calls originating within Des Peres city limits will be handled by the City of Kirkwood including police, fire and emergency medical service. This decision was formalized by both cities in early-January with an official cutover date of April 1 following months of careful planning and cooperation between the two cities to ensure a seamless transition.

Kirkwood operates a joint dispatching operation as an extension of their Police and Fire departments in which Glendale and Warson Woods are currently members. Des Peres has contracted with Kirkwood for Fire & EMS dispatching services since 2016 and will now expand that arrangement to include calls for police service. The decision for Des Peres to outsource emergency dispatching to Kirkwood using a consolidated format was motivated almost entirely

Standalone dispatching centers are becoming rare in the St. Louis region given the extraordinary costs associated with maintaining the technology and infrastructure, training employees on new equipment and protocols, and meeting accreditation standards. These financial and operating burdens make it highly attractive for smaller cities like Des Peres to combine operations into regional assets that serve a broader population, a trend that has emerged over the past two decades with great success. Today, these centralized dispatching centers, such as the dispatch center Kirkwood operates, dominate the St. Louis market and represent nearly 75% of all dispatching services provided to the region.

Mayors For Meals Food **Donation Drive**

The City of Kirkwood, in partnership with the St. Louis Area Foodbank, will participate in Mayors for Meals 2021. This event will take place on Saturday, May 8th from 9am-12pm at the Historic Kirkwood Train Station, A National Guard truck will be at the Train Station to collect donations from residents of Kirkwood and its surrounding communities. Suggested donation items



include; canned meat, canned vegetables, canned fruit, peanut butter, cereal, pasta, dish soap, sanitizing wipes, soap, lotion, toothpaste, baby formula, feminine products, shampoo/conditioner, diapers, toilet paper and paper towels.

Since last March, the St. Louis Area Foodbank has distributed close to 50 million meals, a 39% increase compared to pre-pandemic efforts, with 75% of individuals reporting they were seeking additional assistance as a result of COVID-19. Although restrictions are easing up around the metro area, and people are looking to get back to a more normal way of life, the effects of COVID-19 are still being felt, and those in our communities who are most vulnerable, are still in need of our help.

Last year the St. Louis Area Food bank collected over 53,000 lbs of donated items from 26 participating municipalities, including Kirkwood. Let's do our best to beat that record this year!
