COVID-19 Vaccination Clinic

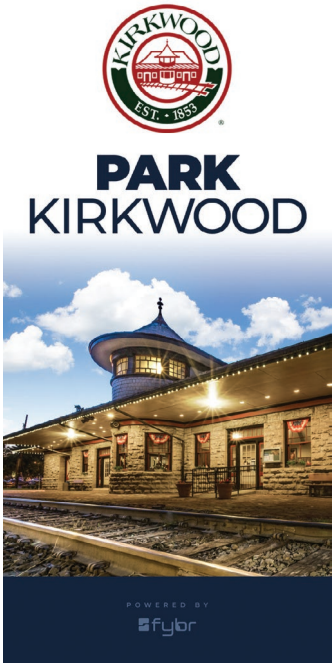
Kirkwood Parks & Recreation is hosting a second Vaccine Clinic on June 4, 2021 from 8:00am to 4:00pm. Registration is required. You may register at <https://tinyurl.com/KirkwoodVaccine> or by calling 314-822-5855. If you received your 1st vaccine dose at the Kirkwood Community Center on May 7th you do not need to register. All three vaccines will be offered (Moderna, Pfizer and

J&J). Please indicate which vaccine you prefer when you register. If you choose to receive the Pfizer vaccine please be aware that a parent or guardian must be present for ages 12-15, and a consent form must be completed and signed by a parent or guardian for ages 16-17. Consent forms are available at the time of registration and on the day of the clinic.

Kirkwood Partnership with Fybr Brings Smart Parking to Downtown Kirkwood

The City of Kirkwood has agreed to a partnership with Fybr, a smart parking technology company, to create a better consumer parking experience in downtown Kirkwood. As part of the partnership, Fybr has installed 275 wireless in-ground parking sensors to provide residents and visitors with live parking occupancy data. The Fybr Parking Sensor is an intelligent edge device that provides accurate, real-time detection for every space, is designed for years of low-maintenance service, and utilizes a state-of-the-art MEMS magnetometer to sense vehicle presence. Residents and visitors can access this data using Park Kirkwood, a mobile way-finding app that is available in the Apple App store and Google Play store. This application will provide drivers with real-time space availability—minimizing the need for circling, double-

parking and unnecessary congestion. The intent is to increase parking efficiency and provide a simpler, more convenient parking experience. Fybr’s Smart Parking technology is in use in multiple cities across the country such as San Francisco, Washington D.C, Columbus and Seattle. By installing the parking sensors in 275 spaces downtown at no cost to the city, this will allow Fybr to test their technology in a local environment. A little larger than the size of a hockey puck, the parking sensors collect no information or data from the vehicle owner. When the sensors detect that a vehicle has entered a parking space, that information is sent to a nearby microprocessor that delivers this information to the mobile app. The mobile app, Park Kirkwood, is available in the Apple App store and Google Play store.
