

SPRAY FOUNTAIN IN KIRKWOOD PARK CLOSING **JULY 30** FOR REPAIRS

The Spray Fountain in Kirkwood Park will be closed for about four days beginning Monday, July 30, for maintenance work. The area will be cordoned off with tape, and a new safety surface in the basin surrounding the fountain will be installed. Depending on weather and how long the new surface takes to cure, the area could be re-opened by Thursday, August 2. We apologize for the inconvenience.



CHICKEN COOPS IN KIRKWOOD

Chicken coops are allowed by ordinance in the City of Kirkwood. There is no limit on the number of chickens that may be kept on an individual's property. However, selling eggs from the chickens is not allowed. The chickens must remain on the owner's property at all times. The City has received complaints about roosters making noise at dawn. The City does not regulate this, but if a resident believes the noise of a rooster is disturbing the peace, it can be reported to the Kirkwood Police Department. They will investigate, but they must be able to hear the actual noise to make a determination.

KIRKWOOD POLICE RECEIVE MULTIPLE GRANTS

Successful grant-writing exemplifies the City's core value of stewardship, described in the 2017 Strategic Plan this way: "We prudently and efficiently manage financial and human resources while promoting a sustainable environment." Accordingly, the Kirkwood Police Department applied for and received the following grant awards:

- \$10,000, for seat belt enforcement, from MoDOT
- \$11,000 for hazardous moving violation equipment, from MoDOT
- \$16,200 toward the purchase of a vehicle to be used by the traffic division, from MoDOT
- Equipment grant: License Plate Reader unit, from Missouri Police Chiefs Charitable Foundation
- Equipment grant: 9 rapid ID units (handheld fingerprint ID system), from Missouri Police Chiefs Charitable Foundation
- Private grant for the purchase of two motorcycle helmets for the traffic division
- Private grant for the refurbishing of a 1968 Harley motorcycle to be used for parades and exhibitions

KIRKWOOD FIRE DEPARTMENT **CELEBRATES 100 YEARS**

Wednesday, July 25, marked the 100-year anniversary of the career fire department in the City of Kirkwood. On that date in 1918, the first paid, full-time fire department went on duty in the City. This new department replaced the volunteer fire company that had been organized after a huge fire wiped out the City armory in 1904. A volunteer bucket brigade served the City prior to that, beginning in 1853. The current department is served by 54 men and women. These proud members deliver an allhazards response service from three strategically placed fire stations, serving the cities of Kirkwood and Oakland.
