YOUR KIRKWOOD PARK BOARD

The Kirkwood Park Board consists of nine members, appointed by the Kirkwood City Council for rotating three-year terms. The primary focus of the Park Board is the maintenance and planning for parks within the park system, and is directly responsible for expenditures from the Park Maintenance Fund.

Parks and Recreation services are funded primarily through:

1. ½ Cent Parks, Recreation and Stormwater Sales Tax
2. Property Tax for Park Maintenance
3. Fees and Charges for Services

Other funding sources include grants, donations, interest on fund balances and sale of surplus equipment.

VENUE SPOTLIGHT: KIRKWOOD PERFORMING ARTS CENTER



July 2021 marked the official Grand Opening of the Kirkwood Performing Arts Center (KPAC) after construction began in the fall of 2018. This state-of-the-art facility, located at 210 E. Monroe Ave., will be the new home of STAGES St. Louis, and will host productions from many other local, regional, and national performing arts organizations. The KPAC is comprised of the 525-seat mainstage Ross Family Theater, a Studio Theater suited to smaller productions with flexible seating arrangements, a 2000-square-foot event space, and a 3,500-square-foot event lawn. It also boasts a spacious 2-story lobby that has hosted COVID-friendly opera performances on the grand staircase. Stop by to see the KPAC for yourself!

The Robert G. Reim Theater at the Kirkwood Community Center remains open for rentals and will continue to host the Kirkwood Youth Theatre program.
